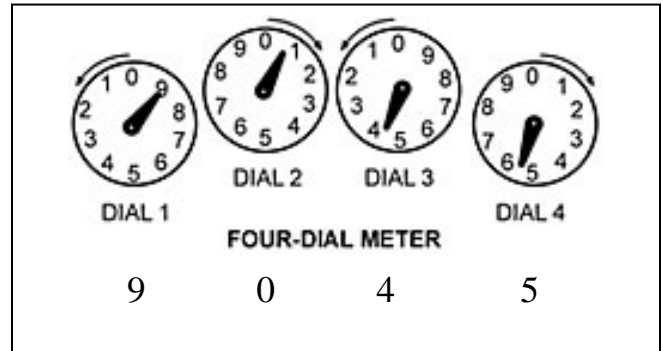




HOW TO READ YOUR GAS METER

Your gas meter is an accurate, automatic measuring instrument. It tracks how much gas flows through it by counting the filling and emptying of the compartments inside the meter. Since each compartment fills with the same amount of gas every time, the measuring is very accurate. And because one compartment is emptied as another is being filled the flow of gas to the various appliances is smooth and uninterrupted.



On the first three dials, take the number the pointer has just passed.

On the last dial, take the number the pointer is nearest.

Pay close attention to the direction the dials turn.

The 2nd and 4th dials turn clockwise but the 1st and 3rd dials turn counterclockwise.

HOW MUCH GAS DO YOU USE?

One reading doesn't tell you how much gas you use. Put your first reading on line 1 below. Take another reading several days later and enter it on line 2. Subtract reading 1 from reading 2. This tells you the number of cubic feet of gas used during the time between the readings.
